<p>DAY ONE: Be an Advocate Ask a friend to take this challenge with</p>	<p>DAY TWO: Rethink Homelessness! https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=jLbP-SpXAp8</p>	<p>DAY THREE: The homeless usually have no access to transportation Place a quarter in your jar for every vehicle in your home.</p>	<p>DAY FOUR: DID YOU KNOW? <i>The average age of a homeless person is 11 years old. In 2022, 2.5 million children were homeless in America. That's 1 out of every 30 kids.</i></p>	<p>DAY FIVE: Only 56% of homeless have internet access. This makes virtual learning hard. Place a quarter in your jar for every device you own</p>	<p>DAY SIX: Homeless are often lonely. Draw a happy picture and give it to the next homeless person you see.</p>
<p>DAY SEVEN: RAISE AWARENESS! Share something you learned this week with a friend.</p>	<p>DAY EIGHT: People experiencing homelessness often have difficulty accessing clean and safe water. Place a quarter in your jar for every water fountain at your school.</p>	<p>DAY NINE: You may have a classmate who is homeless. Listen to Kaylynn's story. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=0UQEoiPajc8</p>	<p>DAY TEN: <i>For people experiencing homelessness it is difficult to find access to phones.</i> Place a dollar in your jar for every working phone in your household today.</p>	<p>DAY ELEVEN: Like Kaylynn, often homeless who are sheltered share beds or may not have a bed at all. Place a quarter in the jar if you have your own bed.</p>	<p>DAY TWELVE: People experiencing homeless often lack access to a bathroom. Place a quarter in the jar for every toilet in your home.</p>
<p>DAY THIRTEEN: True or False? <u>Homeless children look different than other kids?</u> <i>False! Homeless children usually go under the radar and no one knows they have no home. Put a quarter in if you guessed true.</i></p>	<p>DAY FOURTEEN: BE AN ADVOCATE! Donate a book or toy to a local shelter. </p>	<p>DAY FIFTEEN: <i>Homeless children are often not able to participate in sports that cost money.</i> Place a quarter in your jar if you play any sports.</p>	<p>DAY SIXTEEN: Homeless are often unable to get out of the rain and stay dry. Donate 1 emergency poncho to CAPCA.</p>	<p>DAY SEVENTEEN: People experiencing homelessness lack access to showers. Place a quarter in your jar for every shower taken in your house today</p>	<p>DAY EIGHTEEN: The homeless tend to go under the radar when discussing Covid-19. Place a dollar in the jar for every time you have quarantined since Covid started.</p>
<p>DAY NINETEEN: <i>For people experiencing homelessness sometimes it is difficult to find food.</i> Donate a \$5 gift card to PHC</p>	<p>DAY TWENTY: <i>People experiencing homelessness are often stereotyped, labeled and judged.</i> Write a note of encouragement and give to the next homeless you see.</p>	<p>DAY TWENTY ONE: <i>Did you know that up to 26% of the homeless population has a pet?</i> Donate one can or small bag of cat or dog food to CAPCA.</p>	<p>DAY TWENTY TWO: <i>Because it is hard for homeless people to stay in one place, it can be hard for the children to go to school.</i> Place a dime in the jar for every year you have went to school.</p>	<p>DAY TWENTY THREE: Even with generous donations, homeless shelters are running out of food quickly. Donate a box of your favorite cereal to a food pantry.</p>	<p>DAY TWENTY FOUR: During winter months, the homeless can find it hard to stay warm. Place a dime in the jar for every jacket or coat your family owns.</p>
<p>DAY TWENTY FIVE: People experiencing homelessness often can't afford to go to the doctor. Place a nickel in the jar if you have been to the doctor before.</p>	<p>DAY TWENTY SIX: CAPCA always needs volunteers to help our community. They can get burned and dehydrated very easily. Donate a new bottle of sunscreen and refillable water bottle</p>	<p>DAY TWENTY EIGHT: People who are homeless walk a lot and their shoes wear out quickly. For every pair of shoes you own, place a dime in your jar.</p>	<p>DAY TWENTY NINE: BE AN ADVOCATE! Ask someone to donate to your jar. Big or small ANYTHING HELPS!!</p>	<p>DAY THIRTY: Congratulations! When:

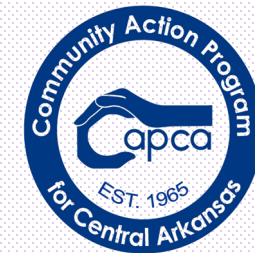
November 1, 2023 - November 30, 2023
